Detailed Narrative:

This field visit was conducted in response to a complaint received by the Ministry of Labour Health.

The complainant alleges the following health and safety concerns:

- 1. on 1 Sept. 2014, the employer did not follow the work refusal procedure in the emergency department, re: three Environmental Aide (EAs) refusing a terminal clean of a suspected Ebola patient's room,
- 2. the employer did not permit JHSC Worker-Co Chair, CUPE to investigate the incident on the 1 Sept. 2014,
- 3. the employer misdirected staff in what personal protective equipment (PPE) to use and procedures to follow.
- 4. the employer has not trained the staff in their viral haemorrhagic fever policy,
- the EAs have not received training with respect to PPE required under the viral haemorrhagic fever policy.
- 6. the PPE for the viral haemorrhagic fever policy is not readily available, and
- 7. the revised policy for viral haemorrhagic fever has not been provided to the JHSC for review.

Inspectors Actions and Findings:

- the employer provided information that a work refusal did occur on the evening of the 31 August 2014 and 1 September 2014,
- information was provided that on the evening of the August 31st, two EA refused to clean a patient's room in the Emergency Department (ED), who was suspected of having Ebola,
- the EA refusal was for lack of training on the procedures required for the cleaning of the room and the personal protective equipment (PPE) required to be worn,
- the employer initiated the work refusal process,
- a committee member who represents workers was not available at the time of the refusal,
- an EA union representative who was present and on duty at the workplace was contacted to represent the refusing workers.
- it was stated that the refusal was not resolved at that time and on the 1st September, a 2nd refusal involving three EA occurred.
- the employer believed the refusal was resolved, when another EA who was familiar with the refusal, agreed to clean (terminal clean) the suspected Ebola's patient room.
- -Section 43 of the Occupational Health and Safety Act (OHSA) was discussed and reviewed at the time of this visit.
- this inspector determined that Section 43(6)(c) of the OHSA was contravened for failure to notify an inspector (Ministry of Labour),
- order(s) issued

H&S Concern #2 - the employer did not permit the JHSC Worker-Co Chair, CUPE to investigate the incident on the 1 Sept. 2014,

Inspectors Actions and Findings:

- information was provided that the JHSC Worker Co-Chair, CUPE was not on duty or present in the workplace at time the refusals occurred and
- Section 43(4) was discussed and reviewed.
- the Occupational Health and Safety Act does not compet an employer to call a JHSC member into the workplace to perform the duties of a JHSC member while not at work.

- the employer has recently updated the infection prevention and control procedures IC-Viral Hemorrhagic Fever Management of a Patient with (policy number 026-MED), but had not provided information and instruction to all EA workers on the updated procedures, including additional PPE
- order(s) issued

H&S Concern #4 - the employer has not trained the staff in their viral haemorrhagic fever policy,

Inspectors Actions and Findings:

- information was provided that not all EA workers have received information and instruction on the policy,
- order(s) issued

H&S Concern #6 - the PPE for the viral haemorrhagic fever policy is not readily available

Inspectors Actions and Findings:

- the employer has prepared Ebola kits for the Emergency Department (ED), Labour and Delivery (L&D) and
- the locations for the Ebola kits was based on the employer's assessment,
- patients coming into the workplace would have first contact with the ED or with L&D,
- not all workers who were contacted during this field visit, were aware of the location(s) of the Ebola kits and replacement stock.
